

WHERE DOES MY MEMBERSHIP FEE GO?

MRMTA Executive is asked this question from time to time and since there has been a change to the fees for the 2021-2022 year it seemed like a good opportunity to update this information for our members.

Q: How is the membership fee determined?

A: Fees are determined by adding the insurance premium, CFMTA dues, Branch fees, and provincial administrative costs.

Q: How much does the insurance cost?

A: There is an increase to the insurance premium for 2021-22 to \$60 per member. In October 2020 MRMTA members were informed of a change to the liability insurance provider. The previous amount was \$40.

<u>Please Note:</u> The MRMTA Executive voted to cover \$10 of the increase to 'soften the blow' to members for the 2021-22 year.

Q: What is the CFMTA and why do I pay dues to support it?

A: CFMTA stands for Canadian Federation of Music Teachers' Associations. Each province and the Yukon and Northwest Territories are members of this federation. MRMTA Treasurer, Lori Jede, remits \$37 per member to CFMTA to support national Awards and Competitions, Young Artist program, Canada Music Week programming, and administration.

<u>Please Note:</u> For the 2020-21 year and again for the 2021-22 year, MRMTA is covering a \$2 increase per member.

Q: Where does the rest of my membership fee go?

A: The remaining amount goes to office expenses, banking fees, website fees, advertising costs, and honoraria for the Registrar, Secretary/Treasurer, Webmaster, and Take Note editor. Provincial programming costs for things like Performance Scholarships and Musicthon also come from your fees. If you are a member of Brandon and Westman Branch or the Southern Manitoba Branch, a portion of your fee goes directly to Branch programming.

Q: Is a Take Note subscription included with my membership?

A: The online version of the magazine is included and available to all members. In fact, many of you are probably reading this article online right now! If you would like to receive a paper copy of the magazine, please add \$18 to your membership renewal fee. The modest increase from \$15 to \$18 for the 2021-22 year more accurately reflects current printing and mailing costs per issue.

MRMTA ZOOM MASTERCLASSES WITH FACULTY OF MUSIC AT U OF MANITOBA

ur annual event of masterclasses with the professors of the Faculty of Music at the University of Manitoba took place on Sunday afternoon, on January 17. For the first time, due to the pandemic, it was presented in a virtual format, but this challenge did not stop the enthusiasm of an audience of 49 teachers and students. We had 5 simultaneous classes: piano, voice, cello, violin and flute, with a total of 19 students participating in this learning experience.

The Piano class was conducted by Professor David Moroz, and featured the following students:

Grace and Anna-Lucia played 2 well known Sonatas by Beethoven, the A flat Major opus 26, 1st mvt, and "La Pathétique", 1st mvt, while Zixiang played a Prelude and Fugue in B flat Major by Bach, and Jaden the Impromptu in A flat Major by Schubert.

So, a nice variety from Baroque to Romantic, with a deeper study of Beethoven's work.

We went overtime, but we were all caught in the magic of the moment, and we all stayed until the end!

During this time, the Voice class was facilitated by Professors Mel Braun and Laura Loewen, in a different virtual room, featuring 3 students:

The violin and cello classes were open to students of Level 6 and up, to reach more students, and this was a good strategy as we succeeded to fill out these 2 classes this year, for the first time. All the other classes were open to students in Level 8 and more advanced.

Finally, the Flute class was conducted by Layla Roberts and Laurel Ridd, featuring these 4 students, all studying with Lori Jede: • Holly Penner, Jane Tully, Vivian Zhao, and a fourth one who wishes to remain unnamed.

Holly played a Sonata by Poulenc, 1st mvt, Jane played a Sonata in E flat major,1st mvt, by J.S. Bach, Vivian performed "Trois Pièces" and "Jade" by Ferroud and the fourth student played "Concertino" by Chaminade. Again, a nice variety in the program, showing that the students in all our classes have a taste for different styles, because we never "arrange" the program, we just take the registrations as they come!

We would like to thank these students for their great work in their preparation for these masterclasses, and their teachers as well. A special thank you to the MRMTA teachers who were hosting these classes: Michele Leclerc for the Piano class, Linda De Pauw for the Voice class, Tianhao Wang for the Violin class, Natalie Dawe for the Cello class and Lori Jede for the Flute class. Many thanks to the teachers and professors from the Desautels Faculty of Music, who give generously of their time, every year, to support our students and share their passion with them. Their contribution is most appreciated, first by the students who have an amazing experience, but also by all the audience who always learn something new. We hope that this partnership continues in the years to come, and hopefully, in a live masterclass!

The enthusiastic and generous response of teachers, students and donors to the virtual format of "Kids Helping Kids" Musicthon 2021 was a wonderful

reflection of how music can indeed change our world for the

better.

Musicthon 2021 premiered on MRMTA's YouTube channel on February 7th and featured 149 student performances. An additional 86 students participated via private studio events or student's performance choice. It was easier than ever for students to participate this year, which reflected in the numbers as we had over 100 more student participants this year as compared to last year's event. Another benefit of this virtual event was the ability to reach a wider audience. For example, an email received from a listener in

response to the CBC Radio's The Weekend Morning Show interview, "I heard about this event on CBC on Sunday, started to look at it on Sunday night... I'd like to watch all of it eventually.

Also, I'll tell some friends about it."

Special thanks to Corey Francis (Piano Expressions with Corey) and Lori Jede, as their studios rallied together and raised the top studio totals of \$2,358 and \$1,405 respectively. children in the lower income demographic, including **Tiny Tunes** music classes

in eight Winnipeg inner city daycares.

RD: How long have you been an MRMTA member and could you share a favourite memory with MRMTA?


