

HOLTBY SCHOLARSHIPS


Submission deadline: Sunday, May 1st, 2022 @ 11:59pm.

2022 PAPER SCHOLARSHIPS

Submission deadline: March 1st, 2022

The application deadline for paper scholarships is **March 1, 2022**. Paper scholarships are just that, a submission in writing, no performance necessary. There are several scholarships available including the *Marian Nelson Memorial Piano Pedagogy Award*, the *Dorothy Lother Award*, and the *Judith Ritchie Award* to name a few. Some scholarships are geared for students with financial challenges, others are geared to ability and dedication to pursuit of excellence. Last year, over \$7,750.00 was given out. MRMTA Scholarships: A Brief History

here is a long and interesting history of scholarships awarded by the MRMTA and the MMTA, its predecessor. In 1924, nearly a century ago, the first scholarship was established by the Manitoba Music Teachers' Association. It was in memory of James W. Matthews, recording secretary from 1919-1923, and was awarded to a Grade 7 violin or piano student. The \$100 scholarship would be equivalent to approximately \$1,500 today! Many awards, too numerous to mention, were added over the following years for levels from Grade 1 to Licentiate Diploma.

Since 1987 The Winnipeg Foundation has administered all MRMTA scholarship funds. Some funds have kept the names of their principal donors, for example the Holtby Scholarships, or the Grace Rich-Bastin awards. The Performance Scholarships, however, come from interest generated by bequests and donations by MRMTA members and supporters.

By giving to the "Manitoba Registered Music Teachers' Association Fund" at The Winnipeg Foundation, you are helping today's young, aspiring musicians, and those of the future. No donation is too small to help make a difference!



MUSICTHON

This year MRMTA is hosting its 33rd annual "Kids Helping Kids" Musicthon fundraiser, helping children access music programs regardless of income or needs. It will take place February 12-13 at Kildonan Place Shopping Centre (*subject to current health orders). Musicthon 2022 will feature live student performances on a piano provided by St. John's Music. In addition, the "student choice" will remain an option for those unable to present at the live event, for students who collect pledges and commit to share their performance through alternate means on their own (ex. school, virtually etc.).





This year we are excited to partner with United Way Winnipeg, with donations supporting youth music programs at a variety of their donor-funded agency partners across Winnipeg, including:

- **Teen Stop Jeunesse** mentor youth in guitar, drums, piano and vocals. Youth may also learn music production, audio engineering and recording.
- Rossbrook House drop-in program runs several times each week and offers free musical instruction led by experienced, contracted music instructors.
- Maples Youth Activity Centre and Kildonan Youth Activity Centre offer a guitar program and lessons, and will soon introduce a ukulele program.
- **Graffiti Art Programming** hosts a recording studio, song writing workshops, and music tutorials.
- West Broadway Youth Outreach provides free private piano and guitar lessons and "jam sessions" where kids learn about different instruments through free play.
- Mood Disorders Association of Manitoba offers the M.A.D. (Music, Art, and Dance) camp for youth aged 12-17.

Teachers may now sign up online for **performance spots** and to **volunteer**. We are optimistic that public health orders will allow us to host our event in-person, though we ask that you please stay tuned closer to the date as there may be some additional requirements communicated or changes made to the event, including the possibility of moving virtual once again.

Musicthon is about giving back to our community and "Kids Helping Kids". All MRMTA teachers and their students are invited to participate, no matter the age or level. Check out mrmta.org for specific details on how to register and donate.

EVENTS IN REVIEW - WORKSHOP

"You Can't Motivate Students"

A LESSON FROM THE SELF-DETERMINATION THEORY RESEARCH

PRESENTED BY KAREN GERELUS

On Sunday, October 3rd, we had the great pleasure of meeting Karen Gerelus, who is currently conducting research at the University of Calgary on identity and motivation in piano students as part of her PhD studies. The research shows that you can't actually motivate anyone to do anything...however, you can create an environment in which the students motivate themselves. Attending the workshop was Elsie Machovec, an MRMTA member for many years, who wrote the following report for us.



Take a lesson from the Self-Determination Theory Research compiled by *Richard Ryan* and *Edward Deci*, University of Rochester, New York. The discussion is the "what and why" of goal pursuits, human needs and the self-determining of behaviour as it relates to our musical students.

Three basic psychological needs are mentioned. There is YOU (competence, environment essential to well-being, etc.), RELATEDNESS (fully connected, it matters to you) and AUTONOMY (congruent with yourself, self-endorsed).

Then, there is the Spectrum of Motivation:

- A. A motivation (non-regulation, impersonal)
- B. Extrinsic:
 - 1. External: externally, reward, punishment
 - 2. Introjection: somewhat external, ego involvement, self-control
 - 3. Identified: somewhat internal, personal importance, conscious valuing

C. Intrinsic: internally, interest, enjoyment, satisfaction

This study is fascinating. Karen has presented this workshop at the CFMTA annual conference, and for different provincial associations. We would like to thank her for her work and for taking the time to do this presentation to the teachers and students in Manitoba.
