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

### THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



I'm sure we are all glad to see the snow disappear and geese return. The year has flown by as we tackle projects and prepare students for deadlines. Although my term as MRMTA president was somewhat shorter than

the usual two years, having taken over in January of 2023, it came at what feels like a turning point. Maybe being thrown into things is best as I had very little idea what lay ahead and had to quickly learn to do jobs as they arose. Although I have been a member of the Brandon and SW Branch of the MRMTA for several years, it's been an eye opener to know how much the provincial and national executives do to keep programs operational. Following Covid, 2022/23 was a recovery year; 2023/24 has become the year of examining what works and what doesn't. We are finding that in order to stay relevant, we need to provide incentives for membership for established teachers and make membership more accessible to students. Examining the By-Laws requirements has been a first step in this regard. Our recent revisions to the By-laws will, we hope, allow a less complicated process for student membership and bring beginning teachers into the association. Connecting teachers throughout the province continues to be a challenge for many Manitoba music organizations. From Winnipeg to Brandon/ SW to the Southern Branch, exciting things are happening everywhere and MRMTA is working to reflect the entire province. With representation and a voice from all areas of the province, we hope to more effectively meet the needs of all teachers. A next step would be to expand our membership in Northern Areas so that these teachers can also take advantage of what MRMTA has to offer.

I have been fortunate during my term to meet

many passionate teachers and to hear some fine performances by their students. The programs which MRMTA members have continued to organize this year have included the following: Canadian Composer workshops in Boissevain, the Suzuki program and Canada Music Week workshops/ concert in Brandon & SW, the connections, programming and conversations which are happening in the Morden, Winkler and Southern Branch communities as well as Musicthon, U of M workshops and the Canada Music week workshops/ concert in Winnipeg. All of these, along with the Composition Competition, Performance and Paper Scholarships as well as the Young Artist Western Finals Competition has shown that the association still plays an important role in providing opportunities for Manitoba music teachers and their students. I would like to congratulate all of the members who have worked so hard to keep these programs alive.

As my term comes to an end, thanks go to Evangeline Keeley for her support and encouragement as well as John Himes who has been a great help handling all administrative duties and any other jobs which happened to come his way. Thanks also to Rachel Dueck for her many hours as editor of *Take Note*. Rachel will be leaving her position and we wish her well moving forward.

Best of luck to Laura Liu who will take over as MRMTA president for 2024-2026. A reminder that this year's AGM will be a ZOOM meeting on June 23rd with Branches hoping to plan their own in-person gatherings. See you all at the AGM.






## Canada Music Week Workshop and Concert in Brandon
