

Looking ahead, 2024 and 2025 promise a full calendar of exciting opportunities, including:



The 2024 concert featuring Anna-Lucia Mena Shevchenko, pianist, was held in Brandon in the Lorne Watson Recital Hall at the School of Music, Brandon University. Due to unforeseen circumstances, the concert had to be rescheduled from September to Sunday, October 6 at 2:30 p.m.

Anna-Lucia performed with great energy and artistry, with depth of musical expression and creativity. She described playing the Steinway:

"The piano had a beautiful singing tone, the acoustics were magical, and the lighting in the stage was just perfect."

Admission was by donation and a reception with refreshments followed the concert. Students and community members really enjoyed meeting Anna-Lucia and her mom, Yaroslava.

WESTERN YOUNG ARTIST WINNIPEG CONCERT

On Sunday, September 22, 2024, Anna-Lucia Mena Shevchenko, winner of the 2024 Western Young Artist Concert Tour, presented the first of her performances. She invited us into a rich Chopin experience with the *Nocturne in C minor*, op. 48, no.1. This selection, with the wide range of emotion, was followed by the technically challenging sweeping arpeggios of the Etude in C minor "Ocean", op. 25, no. 12. After these exciting performances, she played one of Chopin's greatest achievements, the *Ballade in F minor*, op. 52, no. 4. Her presentation of the introduction and the first haunting theme drew us into the intense drama of this composition.

After the intermission, the Chopin influence was clear in the choice of the *Musical Moment*, op. 16, no. 4 by Rachmaninov. The technical aspects here present an exercise in strength, stamina and accuracy. Next, we heard the demanding Chopin *Polonaise in F# minor "Tragic"*, op. 44, no. 5, with its complex harmonies, recurring rhythmic drive, and deep emotional expression of both beauty and sadness. The final selection on the program was the powerful and entertaining arrangement of the *Malagueña*, Ernesto Lecuona – Arcadi Volodos.

The Chopin *B Minor Mazurka* encore was a delightful choice with a subtle hint back to a Mazurka in the middle of the Polonaise.

Seventeen-year-old Anna-Lucia has played the piano for seven years, under the direction of her mother, Yaroslava Shevchenko. At this young age, the repertoire was presented with confidence and proficiency. Anna-Lucia demonstrated a convincing level of maturity in this very ambitious program. We look forward to following her continued development, achievements and performance opportunities!

This amazing concert tour experience started with the concert in Winnipeg. I performed in the same church that the Young Artist competition took place. I instantly recalled the feeling I had when I performed there. I felt so excited and grateful to be on that stage and be able to play beautiful music for such a warm and enthusiastic audience. I played on a very bright and colorful Yamaha, perfect for Rachmaninov. Once I performed my program, which mainly consisted of works by Chopin, I was showered with so many gorgeous flowers! On the way back we went for a beautiful riverside walk surrounded by the gorgeous South Saskatchewan river, flowing through the heart of the city, majestic tall trees, and a beautiful autumn sunset reflecting a magical golden glow all around this lovely place.

Next day I had my concert performance in Saskatoon. I was warmly greeted by an amazing audience, which also included one of my adjudicators, Lynn Ewing, with whom I have had very memorable experience from beginning of my career. It felt so magical performing in the church which was decorated with lovely spring themed flowers where you feel embraced by its airy and ethereal ambience due to lots of natural light and soft sun rays coming from huge gothic style windows and central ceiling area right above the place a piano was located for the recital. I was so pleased to hear from the audience felt inspired and moved by the performance. Thank you so much to Mrs. Willette Neijmeijer and Mrs. Laurien Gibson for their dedication to make this concert such a great experience.

The next day I had a concert in Rosetown. Mrs. Claire Seibold was kind and very creative in organizing this concert. As we arrived at the venue, I was in awe with the gorgeous concert hall. Having already played at Carnegie Hall in New York City, pianist Anna-Lucia Mena Shevchenko, 17, still seemed appreciative to do so in Rosetown.

Mena Shevchenko, of Winnipeg, performed a concert at the United Church on Sept. 29 as part of the Western Young Artist Series Tour.

She played classical pieces, four by Fréderic Chopin, one by Sergei Rachmaninov, and closed with Arcadi Volodos' arrangement of Malagueña by Ernesto Lecuona. After a standing ovation from the audience of about 25, Mena Shevchenko played a mazurka by Chopin. She'd

appeared once before on the Saskatchewan leg of the tour: in Saskatoon, before about 20 people. For Mena Shevchenko, the key to playing long pieces of

music without notes is practising.

"I'm doing mostly memory and mechanical work," she said during a reception hosted by organizer Claire Seibold. "I feel more safe on the stage."

That prompted a listener, Debbie McCulloch, to repeat an old joke: "So is it true? How do you get to Carnegie Hall? Practise, practise, practise?"

"It's not that difficult to get into Carnegie Hall," Mena

Shevchenko replied. She performed the prestigious hall in June with other first-prize winners of the American Association for Development of the Gifted and Talented Passion of Music competition in March.

Mena Shevchenko had taken part in it via the internet, as she'd did in at least 10 other international music competitions, winning either first or second prizes

The Carnegie Hall trip was the first time she and her mother, Yaroslava Shevchenko, a Ukrainian piano teacher and musician, to be outside of Canada in many years. Continued on Page 12

This recording was aired on radio and published in a local magazine. Mrs. Claire invited me to her beautiful home for a lovely reception where we got to share our musical experiences and inspirations. The beginning of October started with the Brandon concert. The stage was so classy, the concert hall had an amazing acoustic, and the huge nine foot concert Steinway that vibrated so gorgeous lush sound was the most impressive! I felt so fortunate to perform in such a unique hall and to have this incredible experience. After the concert we had a wonderful reception with a warm personal touch by Prof. Alla Turbanova preparing a delicious homemade pie. I am very grateful to the Brandon Branch President Mrs. Dianna Neufeld and Mrs. Marla Winters for their professionalism and dedication in preparing everything for the concert.

The tour was an incredible experience for me as an artist. This was my first tour, and I can say, that this is essential part for a musician's career to develop and nurture young talent. This concert tour has helped me understand what it looks and feels like to perform in tours and how to manage my strength and energy as a performer. I feel so fortunate to have been given this life changing opportunity and I sincerely wish each artist could experience such joy and inspiration in their musical careers.

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Deadline April 1st, 2025

This award will be given to a deserving teacher who wishes to attend the CFMTA National Conference. It is intended to encourage our RMT's to further their continuing education as professional music teachers. Applicants will be actively involved with MRMTA programmes and involve their students in several annual events both provincially and nationally to qualify. This should ideally be their first time attending the national conference.

When offered, it is also possible to participate in the National Conference online. Should the recipients choose this possibility instead, the committee may also choose a second recipient to attend online as well.

Amount and Deadline

Each conference year, the MRMTA will grant one award amounting to the cost of the registration fee for the conference. The value of this award is around \$500 and will be paid directly to the conference registrar. It is meant to assist the recipient in their participation at the national conference.

Annual Deadline: April 1, 2025

Qualifications

- 1. Serve on the executive committee or a provincial branch committee or volunteer at 2 or more events in one year.
- Participate personally or enroll students in at least one provincial programme in the past year, such as the Canada Music Week concert, perform at Serata: An Evening of Musical Delights, attend the Annual General Meeting, Musicthon, etc.
- Participate personally or enroll students in at least one national programme, in the past year such as the CFMTA E-Festival, Composition Competition, national competitions or serve on a CFMTA committee.

Application Guidelines and How to Apply

To be eligible for this award, the applicant must be a full member of the MRMTA. Applications must be sent to the Chairperson of the Serata Committee and include a 300 - 500 word essay explaining why they should attend the conference and the benefits of this opportunity for their teaching career. Applicants are encouraged to demonstrate a willingness to replicate their learning in the home studio or a workshop setting.

Every application must include:

- 1. Full name and position on executive or committee (if applicable)
- 2. Home address, email and phone number
- 3. Essay of 300 500 words
- Information to support qualifications 1 and 2 (which will include a minimum of 4 programs in which you or your students participated if you are not serving on a committee.)

Selection Process

Each application will be reviewed by a committee which will then announce the award winner at Serata: An Evening of Musical Delights. This fundraising concert happens annually on the first Sunday evening of May. Applicants must be present to receive the award to avoid forfeiting the prize. In the case of non-attendance, the award will be given to the runner-up. In the event of no applications or no recipients, the prize will remain in the fundraising account for the following year's selection process.

Reporting

Acceptance of the MRMTA Professional Development Award requires the applicant to attend the next CFMTA Conference. Recipients are later required to submit a brief report (no more than 200 - 400 words) detailing the professional development classes, workshops etc. attended and how they intend to implement what they've learned in the home studio. This may be featured in our Take Note magazine.



MRMTA Student Composer Competition

Deadline for Entries is April 1st

1. A student may enter more than one composition and more than one class but only one prize will be awarded to any individual. The composition must be a new composition, not previously entered in the CFMTA Student Composer competition.



- 2. The contestant must be eligible in his chosen age group as of the upcoming June 1.
- 3. Each entry is assumed to be the original work of the individual whose name appears on the entry form attached to the manuscript. Any infraction of this regulation could result in the nullification of the offending entry.
- 4. All rights to his/her original work will be retained by the contestant, but winning compositions may be displayed or employed by the MRMTA or CFMTA for publicity purposes after consultation with and agreement of the contestant.
- 5. First place winning manuscripts at the Provincial level may be forwarded by the Provincial Canada Music Week Coordinator to the CFMTA office before June 1st in order to be included in the Canada-wide judging. MRMTA assumes the National entry fee.
- 6. Contestants must be Canadian citizens or legal residents of Canada AND studying with a current member of the Registered Music Teacher's Association. This includes Canadian citizens living in Canada or abroad. Self-taught students do not qualify.
- 7. Manuscripts printed by computers are preferred. If submitting handwritten manuscripts, they should be neat and legibly written in black ink, in regulation manuscript size: including all necessary details of dynamics, editing and tempo, with every 10th measure numbered. Submission of a recording is optional, but recommended if available.
- 8. The judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into after final judging.
- 9. Any National level entrant who moves after June 1st must advise the Provincial Coordinator of his/her new address.
- 10. The winner's cheque must be cashed within thirty days of receipt of same.
- 11. A completed entry form including the appropriate entry fee must accompany each composition submitted. See the Manitoba entry form for details.
- 12. Prizes will not be awarded if the adjudicator feels the standard has not been achieved.
